Walking Through HOLY WEEK

As the Resurrection of the Lord draws near, we enter now into a week of prayer, reflection, and penance. We encourage you to make the most of this Holy Week by participating in the liturgies and parish programming events scheduled throughout the week!

- On Monday, the Archdiocese of Newark will be celebrating the annual Chrism Mass at 8 pm at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark, with Cardinal Joseph Tobin presiding. This is a very special Mass in which the Holy Oils (used for Baptism, Confirmation, Blessing of the Sick) are blessed for all of the parishes across the diocese. If you have not been before, this sacred celebration is a wonderful way to start Holy Week. Visit rcan.org for details.
- On Tuesday, we will host a day of Penance. There are several opportunities for confession throughout the day, culminating with a Penance service in the evening at 7 pm. This will be the last opportunity for confession before Easter, there are no confessions heard on Holy Saturday. Be sure to make time to receive the gifts of God's Grace, Love and Forgiveness before heading into the Easter Season!
- In addition to our usual Holy Week programming featured on this page, there are several new events this year. On Spy Wednesday, the day infamously known for when Judas agreed to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver, our Faith Formation team will host an afternoon of a treasure hunt game and Easter Story lunch for our little ones [ages 4 to 10] reflecting on the theme of the day. Later that evening, we will host our first Christian Passover Celebration in Memorial Hall! The passover meal, although it is a Jewish tradition, is a wonderful opportunity for us as Christians to celebrate the roots of our faith, and the theme of God's redeeming grace, through learning about the symbolism of the Passover meal, as Jesus once experienced it.
- On Saturday, we will Bless the Easter Food and we encourage you to prepare your own basket. Please join us in the Church at 9 am following morning prayer, to take part in this special Easter tradition!

What follows on these pages is a look at Palm Sunday and the Paschal Triduum as Jesus lived it, and how we as Catholics live and remember it today. Learn about some of the symbolism and liturgical traditions that make this week so very special!

Palm Sunday...

...as Jesus lived it, then.

This day marks Jesus' triumphant entrance into the city of Jerusalem. He rode on a donkey, and was greeted by cheering crowds waving and laying palms, as a sign of respect and humility, at his feet. This was to fulfill the prophecy:

Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass Zechariah 9:9



Why a donkey?

A King might enter into a city on a horse if he wanted to wage war, but Jesus arrived on a donkey as a way to show that he was coming in peace.

... As we live it, today.

- Palms are blessed before each Mass.
- At the start of the Mass there is a special procession that includes a short Gospel reading recounting Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem.
- Later on during the Liturgy of the Word, instead of a traditional Gospel reading, the Passion of the Lord is read in narrative form with several speakers including the congregation who takes on the voice of the "crowd". This Gospel recounts the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and death on the cross... a foreshadowing of the days to come.
- At the end of Mass, palms are distributed to the congregation to take home. Palms have been blessed by a priest and are now considered *sacramentals*. This means they should be treated with respect. Keep the palms with you throughout the week while you are in prayer, and invite Jesus into your heart this Holy Week, just as the people at the gates of Jerusalem welcomed him on that triumphant day.

Holy Thursday...

...as Jesus lived it, then.

Jesus gathered with his disciples in an upper room to share in the passover meal. This would later come to be known as the Last Supper. It was during this meal that the Eucharist was first instituted as Jesus broke bread with his disciples, saying

"This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me.. [Luke 22:19]

During the meal, Jesus did something that was unheard of at the time. He got up from the table and washed the feet of his disciples, something that would have been done only by a servant. In doing this, Jesus was demonstrating a true act of love. He was showing that he was here to serve, and his disciples should follow in his example. It was in this moment that the institution of the Priesthood occurred.

"I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do." JOHN 13:15

After dinner, Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane. This was a time of anguish and torment for Jesus, knowing the suffering that was to come for him, while taking on the burden of the sins of the world. This is also known as the Agony in the Garden.

It is during this time that Jesus is betrayed by Judas and arrested by the Roman guards. He is brought before the High Priests, and eventually to Pilate, who will sentence Jesus to death on a cross.

... as we live it, today.



Catholics celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, marking the beginning of the Paschal Triduum (the three day period leading up to the Resurrection of the Lord).

For the most part, the Mass remains similar in structure with a few exceptions:

- *Washing of the Feet:* The priest will wash the feet of parishioners, just as Jesus did for his disciples.
- *During the Liturgy of the Eucharist,* the priest will consecrate more hosts than usual. These will be reserved for the Good Friday Service, since there will be no Mass on that day.
- There is no final blessing from the priest at this Mass. Instead, he will remove the Eucharist from the Tabernacle, where it is transferred to a place of repose. The tabernacle will remain open and empty until the Easter Vigil.
- The altar is stripped bare, leaving a feeling of emptiness that is reflective of the sadness of events to come, when Jesus would soon make his way towards his death on the cross.
- Following Mass, the Church remains open until 10 pm. The faithful are encouraged to stay and take part in silent prayer, keeping Jesus company as his disciples did in the Garden on the night he was betrayed.



Good Friday...

Good Friday is the day of penance, fasting and prayer. Through the texts of the Sacred Scripture and the liturgical prayers, we will be as though gathered on Calvary to commemorate the redemptive Passion and Death of Jesus Christ.

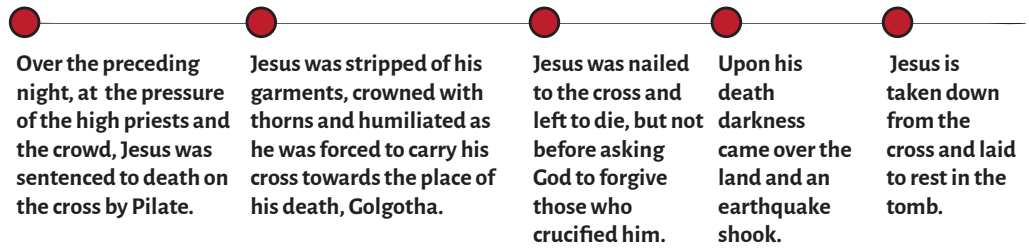
Holy Saturday...

Holy Saturday, until sundown is another solemn day. Jesus is in the tomb. It is a day of prayer and reflection.

Morning Prayer is held at 8:30 am in the Church. There is no morning Mass, and we do not hold confessions on Holy Saturday.

The Solemn nature of the day will turn to joy and renewal at the Easter Vigil....

...as Jesus lived it, then.



... as we live it, today.

Good Friday is a day of fasting. Catholics abstain from eating meat on this day, as with Fridays in Lent.

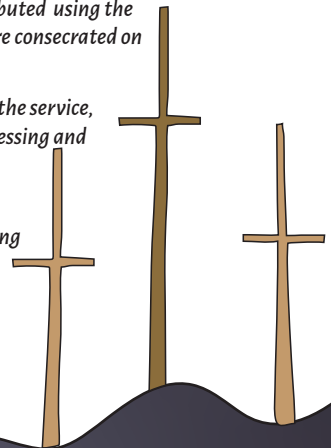
Good Friday is the only day of the year where no Masses are celebrated on this day. There is morning prayer at 8:30 am in the Church.

The height of the day is at 3 pm with the Passion of the Lord service in the Church.

Stations of the Cross will follow in the evening at 6 pm in the Church. The faithful gather together to relive the final steps of Jesus' life in a sort of spiritual pilgrimage. Each "station" marks a particular stop along the way with a description or reflection of what Jesus was experiencing. It is a solemn time meant for prayer and reflection.

What happens at the Passion of the Lord Prayer Service?

- *The service begins with a silent procession. You will see the priests lie prostrate before the altar as a sign of surrender to God.*
- *During the Liturgy of the Word we will hear 2 readings and the Gospel. As on Palm Sunday, the Gospel is read in narrative form, with multiple speakers. The congregation is once again invited to participate, taking on the voice of the "crowd".*
- *Instead of the General Intercessions during the Prayer of the Faithful, Solemn Intercessions are read or sung by the priest to pray for people all over the world. The series starts broadly with the Holy Church, to the Pope, to the ordained etc... down to the smallest level of all people facing hardship and trials. Instead of standing like we normally would during the Prayer of the Faithful, since this is a very solemn occasion we are encouraged to kneel as a sign of humility.*
- *"BEHOLD THE WOOD OF THE CROSS": The next part of the service is the Veneration of the Cross. A large wooden cross is carried to the altar and held up by a priest and altar servers. The faithful then process towards the cross (as you would for Communion) and either bow and kiss the cross, or touch it while genuflecting. This is a symbol of reverence and respect.*
- *Next, we prepare for the Communion Rite where communion is distributed using the extra hosts that were consecrated on Holy Thursday.*
- *At the conclusion of the service, we receive a final blessing and depart in silence.*
- *Many will remain in silent prayer following the service.*



But when it all seemed to be over, [Mary] kept watch, she kept vigil, in expectation, maintaining her hope in the promise of God who raises the dead. Thus, in the world's darkest hour, she became the Mother of believers, the Mother of the Church and the sign of hope.

The Easter Vigil

"In the darkness of Holy Saturday, joy and light will break through with the rites of the Easter Vigil... It will be the encounter in faith with the Risen Christ, and the joy of Easter will continue for all throughout the following 50 days, until the coming of the Holy Spirit. -Pope Francis



The Easter Vigil is considered to be the most holy and sacred Mass of the entire Liturgical Calendar that is rich with symbolism. What sets this joyous Liturgical Celebration apart from Masses on Easter Sunday?

1. Service of Light

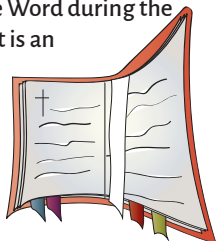
The Easter Vigil begins after sundown, representing the darkness of the tomb. Unlit candles are distributed to the faithful. Outside the Church steps (weather permitting) a bonfire is lit in preparation for the blessing and igniting of the Paschal Candle.

- The celebrant, altar servers, and Ministers of the Word will process towards the altar while the celebrant pronounces 'The Light of Christ'. During the procession, the fire from the Paschal Candle is passed from person to person, until the entire Church is lit by candle light, representing the light of Jesus once again entering into our lives.
- Once the procession reaches the Sanctuary, the Paschal Candle is set in its place and a special hymn known as the Exsultet is proclaimed by the celebrant (also known as the Easter Proclamation).



2. Liturgy of the Word

The Easter Vigil has an extended Liturgy of the Word, with several readings and responsorial psalms following each reading, all leading up to the Gospel. The first reading starts 'In the beginning' with Genesis and the story of creation. The readings continue in chronological order and serve as a historical account of God's intercession with humanity through the ages. While the Liturgy of the Word during the Easter Vigil is quite lengthy, it is an extremely reverent and meaningful experience.



TIP:

Our special Triduum programs are available at the entrance of the church, follow along with the readings, hymns, and order of the Mass all throughout Holy Week and Easter! (Digital Worship aids will also be available on st-teresa.org for all liturgical services).

3. Liturgy of Baptism

One of the most beautiful things to witness while celebrating the Easter Vigil is the Rite of Christian Initiation. We will witness the RCIA candidates who have spent the year learning about the faith, become fully formed members of the Catholic Church. These such members may be converting to Catholicism from another religion, or perhaps were baptized as Catholics but missing sacraments.

The RCIA candidates, with their sponsors, are invited to the Baptismal Font, where they will soon be blessed by the holy baptismal water.

The faithful recite a renewal of Baptismal Promises. The celebrant will ask a series of questions, to which we respond "I do". The priest will then process through the center aisle to sprinkle the congregation with the holy water.



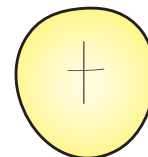
Following the Renewal of Baptismal Promises....

- During the Rite of Baptism, the RCIA candidates go forward with their sponsor, one by one, to the Baptismal Font. They will bow head over the font as the celebrant pours holy water over them, with a Baptismal blessing. During this time, the Litany of the Saints is sung in celebration of welcoming them into the Church!
- Following the Baptism Rite, the sponsors go forward to receive the Light of Christ from the Paschal Candle, and each will pass their candle on to the newly baptized.
- Candle in hand, the newly baptized gather in the sanctuary with their sponsors, standing before the congregation, where they will Profess their Faith for the first time.
- Next, during the Rite of Confirmation, they will become sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and blessed with the Sacred Chrism oil. They are now officially fully initiated members of the Catholic Church!



4. Liturgy of the Eucharist

After the bread and wine have been consecrated to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the newly initiated members of the Church will receive the Eucharist for the first time, along with the rest of the faithful.
