# Photography & Videography Agreement

The Sacrament of Marriage is a sacred liturgical celebration according to the rites and customs of the Catholic Church. All photography and videography personnel are subject to the terms of this agreement.

### **Permitted:**

Check-in with the Parish Wedding Attendant upon arrival for a review of these terms;

General Parameters in the Nave of the Church:

A maximum of two (2) photographers and two (2) videographers are permitted inside the church at any time;

Designated and stationary locations will be assigned to each photographer/videographer;

Photographers may only step forward during the processional, exchange of vows and rings, and recessional; and then remain standing for the rest of the ceremony;

A single stationary video camera may be placed in the choir loft 30 minutes prior to the ceremony. The camera must be removed immediately following the recessional at the end of the ceremony;

Posed photography inside the church following the ceremony will be permitted for 10 minutes;

Any questions about these policies must be directed to the Parish Wedding Attendant, not to the celebrant/priest.

### **Not Permitted:**

Moving around during the ceremony;

Blocking or aisles or exits by persons or equipment;

Flash photography or video lighting;

Moving about the Nave of the church or up and down any aisle throughout the ceremony;

### Audio Restrictions:

Microphone or any other electric wiring may not be taped across the aisles; Sanctuary microphones may not be disconnected or have anything attached to them;

The celebrant/priest will not wear microphones provided by videographers;

### Additional Restrictions:

Photo and video lighting racks;
Altar furnishings and church decorations may not be moved or removed;

The use of drones inside or on the church property is prohibited;

Proper attire is required of all personnel. Jeans, shorts, T-shirts, caps and hats, sneakers, gum chewing, food and drink are prohibited.

- All vendors and their assistants must adhere to these guidelines.
- By signing your initials, you acknowledge that you have read and understand the terms of this agreement, you will provide your vendor with a copy of these terms and conditions, and you understand that the pastor and parish staff reserve the right to refuse entrance or request departure to a photographer or videographer if the guidelines listed above are not followed.
- Failure of a photographer or videographer to follow these guidelines may also impede completion of a ceremony.
- Any violation of these policies will be immediately addressed. Continued violations will result in the Photographer/Videographer being immediately asked to leave the church building and grounds and prevented from future services at STA.
- Refund of your wedding deposit amount is contingent upon compliance with this agreement.

### Floral & Decoration Agreement

The following allowances should be shared with the vendor by the couple.

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### Liturgy & Music Agreement

### Liturgy

- MUSIC Music for the wedding is planned jointly by the couple in consultation with the Director of Liturgy and Music - therefore, we ask that you please do not make any plans or music selections until the consultation. The Sacrament of Marriage is a sacred liturgical celebration according to the rites and customs of the Catholic Church. Therefore, the music best suited for the wedding liturgy would be sacred or liturgical in nature, both before and during the wedding, focused on God's love for us and our love for each other. Sung music texts are to be scriptural or Christ-centered. Other popular songs and secular music, no matter how meaningful they may be, are not appropriate to the sacred liturgy and are better suited to the wedding reception. The style and musicality of the selections must also be fitting and appropriate to the church's liturgical space and within the norms of the parish music ministry.
  - Please refer to the list of suggested and approved music selections as a guide for choosing music that would be appropriate. Pop songs such as Can't Help Falling in Love - Elvis Presley, Hallelujah - Leonard Cohen, and What A Wonderful World - Louis Armstrong, or any others from a similar musical genre would not be considered appropriate for use in the church and therefore are not permitted at St Teresa of Avila.
- MUSIC PERSONNEL The Director of Liturgy and Music is the appointed pianist/organist of Saint Teresa of Avila Church who plays at all weddings. A cantor is provided by the parish to serve as the vocalist/song leader for the liturgy. Outside professional instrumentalists (ie strings, brass, woodwinds) may be booked at an additional fee per musician with the assistance of the Music Director. Guest volunteer musicians, vocalists, or instrumentalists may only be permitted at the discretion of the Music Director.
- 3. PRAYERS AND SCRIPTURE READINGS You will receive the "Together for Life" book to assist in selecting the spoken prayers and scripture readings for the Liturgy of the Word. Be sure you have read through this book entirely before your consultation. Members of the family or the wedding party may be selected to proclaim these readings: Old Testament, New Testament, and the Universal Prayer.

### **Symbols**

- 1. FLOWERS TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Although presenting a small bouquet of flowers at the altar of the Blessed Virgin Mary statue during a Catholic wedding is not part of the official Rite of Marriage, many couples who have a devotion to Mary want to take a moment before the conclusion of the liturgy to offer prayers for her intercession as they begin their life together. The Blessed Mother is a wonderful model of how we are to live out our faith and trust in God. While almost any flower would be appropriate for this devotion, the flowers that have a special connection to the Virgin Mary are lilies, roses, the iris, impatiens, marigolds, violets, the May Hawthorn, and many others.
  - Please consult the Director of Music for the appropriate placement of this element in the liturgy program and the best music choices to accompany the moment (ie Ave Maria - Franz Schubert).
- 2. LIGHTING OF THE UNITY CANDLE This tradition is also not part of the official Rite of Marriage but holds special significance for many couples who wish to incorporate it into their wedding mass or ceremony. The couple must provide their own set of candles, typically sold as a set from most wedding supply vendors, and can be placed on a table with candle holders provided by the church. After the exchange of the vows and rings, the couple proceeds to the table, lighting two small candles, joining their flames to light one larger candle in the center, symbolizing two families being united as one.
  - Please consult the Director of Music for the appropriate placement of this element in the liturgy program and the best music choices to accompany the moment.
- 3. CULTURAL WEDDING TRADITIONS such as the "arras", "lazo", and similar elements are a great gift of many different cultures. In celebrating our diversity, we recognize their value as an integral part of your heritage. However, in the spirit of good order and noble simplicity, we ask that the couple carefully consider the number of primary and secondary sponsors they invite to participate in the liturgy if these cultural options are to be included.



### **Booking Agreement**

- AGREEMENT: We, the couple, have reviewed together and initialed each of the preceding agreements included in the Wedding Handbook. These agreements include the Request for Marriage, Photography and Videography Agreement, Floral and Decoration Agreement and the Liturgy and Music Agreement.
- 2. RULES: We understand the importance of the rules and regulations that are in place with regard to the safety of our guests, respect for the sacred space, and the solemnity of the sacrament of matrimony.
- 3. CONSULT: We agree to consult with the parish staff prior to making any planning decisions with regard to the ceremony that will take place in the church.
- 4. **SECURITY DEPOSIT:** We agree to pay a security deposit fee of \$1,000 with the completed Handbook and Agreements that is non-refundable if the following should occur: 1. the wedding starts late by 15 minutes or more following the agreed upon time and/or; 2. there is non-compliance by a vendor pursuant to these agreements. The security deposit amount is paid separately and is not included in the wedding fee amount.
- 5. WEDDING FEE: Following an initial meeting with the pastor and his subsequent approval to confirm the wedding, we agree to pay the wedding fee amount of \$3,500 in full to secure our wedding date/time within 30 days of the meeting. The wedding fee amount is paid separately and does not include the security deposit.
- 6. CANCELLATION: Should we decide to cancel our requested date and/or not meet the requirements of documentation or preparation, we understand that our deposit may be subject to a \$500 fee deduction (no later than one month prior to the scheduled wedding date).
- 7. CANCELLATION: Should we decide to cancel our booking and/or not meet the requirements of documentation or preparation, we understand that our deposit of \$1,000 is not refundable (within 30 days to the scheduled wedding date).
- 8. **COMPLY:** We recognize and agree to comply with the following rules and regulations not outlined in the previous agreements:
  - a. Timely arrival is required on the day of the rehearsal (date TBD) and the day of the wedding. Late start time of the wedding will result in pre-planned elements of the ceremony being omitted at the discretion of the presider. If livestreaming is provided, one hour is allotted from the scheduled start time of the ceremony and will not be extended for a late start time.
  - b. Time allotment in the church and on the parish property is 45 minutes for a rehearsal and 90 minutes from the scheduled start time for the wedding day. Arrival prior to 30 minutes before the ceremony start time must be approved by staff in advance.
  - c. No food, drink, gum chewing, alcohol or other substances, including cigarettes, cigars, etc, will be allowed on the church premises at any time.
  - d. Attire appropriate to the sacred space is required for all including those in the wedding party and attending guests.
  - e. In the event that we do not invite a guest priest/deacon to preside, a celebrant will be assigned to our wedding ceremony which may or may not be the pastor of St Teresa of Avila Church. We agree to pay the fee for our guest priest/deacon.
